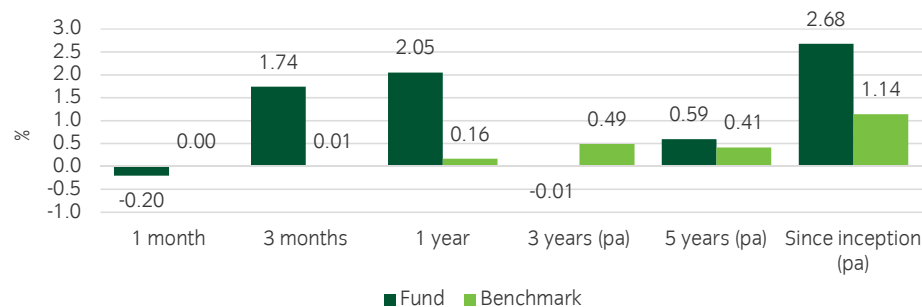
FUND OBJECTIVE

FUND MANAGER COMMENTS

The Fund generated a negative return for the month, underperforming the benchmark. FX and to a lesser degree local rates positions detracted. However, hard currency sovereign bonds were a positive. In Turkey, the long positions in FX and sovereign credit worked well after monetary policy normalisation. In Romania, the long position in local rates helped as the central bank cut rates. However, in Brazil, the long positions in local rates and FX performed poorly as investors' fears around increased fiscal spending and political noise resurfaced. In Ecuador, the long position in sovereign credit performed poorly as investors reduced positions ahead of the presidential elections, while in Indonesia the long position in local rates performed poorly. Our long-term constructive view on emerging markets fixed income remains intact given a cyclical growth upswing; a strong tailwind from higher commodity prices; ongoing easy global financial conditions; and a more predictable US policy.
