FUND MANAGER COMMENTS

The Bank of England kept interest rates unchanged at its April meeting, in line with market expectations. The decision was less finely balanced than previously, with the Monetary Policy Committee voting 8-1 to hold policy, as one member favoured a rate increase rather than a cut. Inflation re-accelerated over the period, with headline CPI rising to 3.3% while core inflation edged lower to 3.1%, reflecting higher energy prices linked to geopolitical tensions. Gilt yields moved higher over the month, with the 2-year gilt yield rising to around 4.4% and the 5-year yield to approximately 4.1% by the end of April. Interest rate markets continued to trade nervously, typically tracking moves in the price of oil and reacting to headlines. Whilst the fragile ceasefire called mid-month removed the possibility of an April rate hike, continued uncertainty over central bank expectations meant that a cautious approach to fixed-rate term investment was adopted, as in the absence of a genuine resolution it was felt that rates could go higher in the short term, with the UK particularly impacted by a spike in inflation and increased political uncertainty ahead of local elections in May. At the end of the review period, two to three rate hikes were priced in, but the focus remained on shorter-dated maturities in order to retain a high level of short-dated liquidity.

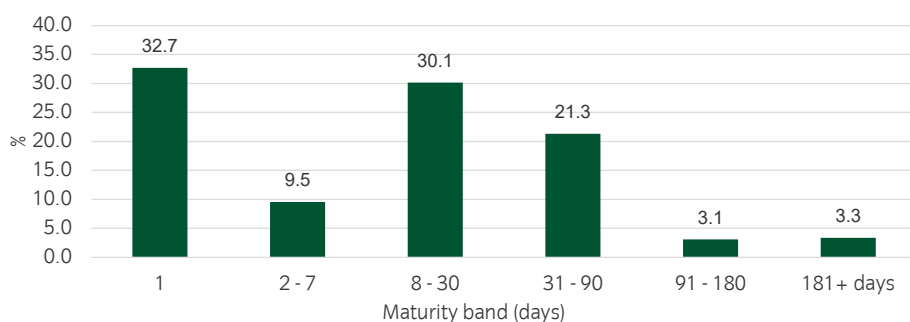

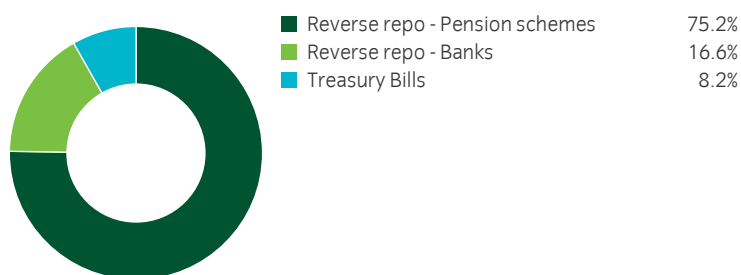
