
FUND MANAGER COMMENTS

The Fund generated a positive return in October. Our short corporate credit position was a small negative. Relative value positions had a neutral effect, as our positioning in eurodenominated investment grade credit versus US dollar-denominated investment grade credit was unchanged. Our long position in asset-backed securities delivered income. Duration contributed, driven by our long positioning in the US. Yield curve positioning detracted due to our steepening position in the US relative to flattening positions in Japan and the UK. Cross-market positioning contributed due to our overweight positions in Australia and Canada relative to the US. Intra-Europe country selection had a neutral impact. We remain overweight Italy and Germany versus underweight France. Our inflation positions detracted. Currency positioning detracted, driven by our overweight positions in the Australian dollar and the euro relative to underweight positions in the Swiss franc and Canadian and US dollars.

DURATION EXPOSURE BY MATURITY


