FUND MANAGER COMMENTS

The Fund had another strong month and outperformed the cash benchmark. In January, leveraged loans posted further gains. The European Leveraged Loan Index registered the best month since January 2023, driven by strong technicals and renewed hopes of waning inflation. Over the month, key contributors included term loans from Refresco, Motor Fuel Group, and Foncia. The European default ratio increased from 1.6% to 1.9%, while the distress ratio fell from 3.96% to 2.80%. January saw the largest refinancing and the second-largest repricing activity in institutional loans on record, as institutional loan issuance reached \$136.1 billion. We expect the default ratio to reach 3.25% in 2024. As more companies come to the market to refinance debt, we expect the average coupon to increase throughout the year. Leveraged loans are still supported by strong technicals, limited supply and a relatively benign default backdrop.


